#### **Cuckmere Buses Are Back**

Like many Community Bus services, the long-established Cuckmere Community Bus Ltd curtailed its operations at the beginning of lockdown due to volunteer availability, but was able to resume its operations (in a limited way) from mid-June. Through July and August more services were resumed with revised timetables. The service was assisted by Mary Laxton and her NHSAngels who supplied face coverings for drivers and passengers. New volunteers were sought through Hailsham Volunteer Hub. On its website, Cuckmere Buses has outlined its cleansing routine as follows: "Here at Cuckmere Buses, your comfort and safety and that of our drivers is our priority, so we wanted to let you know what you can expect when travelling with us, and how to travel with greater confidence in the coming weeks and months...

- Each bus is fogged with a 24-hour antiviral protection spray each evening.
- Higher risk touch areas (grabrails and handles, touchscreens, ticket machines and bell-pushes) are wiped with sanitising wipes by the driver between each trip operated.

- Driver screens are now provided to increase confidence in travelling with us.
- Hand sanitiser is now available on each of our buses. Please use it!
- Windows and ventilators will be kept open whenever possible to improve air circulation within the bus.
- If you do not have a face covering, we can provide one (for a charitable donation) for you to keep.
- We've introduced signage on-board to remind our customers to stay safe and stay apart.

We're not yet able to run all of our services, recognising that passenger numbers remain low and some of our drivers are still selfisolating, but more services are being introduced as soon as we are able to do so."

### **DVLA & Driving Licence** Expiries

**DVLA** has announced that drivers whose photocard driving licence or entitlement to drive runs out between 1 February 2020 and 31 December 2020 will have their entitlement automatically extended from the expiry date, for a period of 11 months. Drivers do not need to apply to renew their licence until they receive a reminder before their extension expires. The initial extension expired at the end of August. This has now been further extended to the end of the year under temporary changes announced by DVLA on 1 September 2020. #### Inverclyde League of Hospital Friends Call for Volunteers

**Greenock Telegraph** has highlighted the need for volunteer drivers of a hospital car scheme: "They were forced to close down during lockdown and now as they start back up again they are faced with the recruitment crisis. The group also runs the Helen Wyllie tea bar which raises tens of thousands of pounds for **Inverciyde Royal** ever year. Chairman Peter Hempsey said: 'The patient transport service is facing a driver crisis and may not be able to continue to offer the service unless more drivers can be found. We need more drivers urgently.' Since lockdown the League have lost a couple of drivers and some are out of action for health reasons. As routine clinics begin to reopen in hospitals, the transport service has been given the go-ahead to start up again. But the service faces restrictions due to social distancing, compulsory face masks and patients are no longer allowed to bring someone with them."

#### CT Praised for its Role in Colchester

The Clacton & Frinton Gazette has reported how local strategic partnership One Colchester which has been "supporting the community response to coronavirus, is continuing to help communities. Since lockdown restrictions began to ease in May, partners have been working hard to ensure the most vulnerable residents and continue to provide support. This has included 566 community transport trips, 4,308 welfare and befriending phone calls and 1,024 prescription pick-ups. Social Enterprise Support Fund Community Fund / Social Enterprise Support Fund are inviting bids from 19 September. Grants are available for  $\pounds 10,000 - \pounds 300,000$  for Social Enterprises who meet with the following criteria:

- In England; your beneficiaries are mostly in England
- An incorporated social purpose organisation, with an asset lock
- Incorporated at least a year ago (i.e. registered with Companies House, the FCA or the Charity Commission)
- Annual income between £25,000 and £1.5 million before COVID-19
- Was financially stable before COVID-19
- Substantially reliant on trading income (e.g. sales and delivery of contracts) to deliver social impact

Additionally they should be working in one of the following areas:

- Connect with older people
- Connect with disabled people
- Provide advice and support to people who are pushed into crisis
- Provide support to those in medical care or end of life care

# Vandalised Minibus is Back on the Road in Charnwood

Leicester Mercury reports that a "charity minibus taken out of service after a vandal attack is back on the road thanks to the generosity of local businesses and the wider community. At the end of July, John Storer Charnwood discovered their accessible minibus severely damaged when the driver collected the vehicle to make its first food parcel deliveries of the day. Vandals had smashed a large side window and ripped out the metal framing to gain entry. They had then thrown the fire extinguishers from the vehicle, poured antifreeze over the vehicle and also urinated inside. The vehicle should have been used to collect the weekly food shop for the **Charnwood Community Action** centralised foodbank and would have then gone on to deliver parcels to households facing significant hardship during the pandemic. Candi Barnes, John Storer Charnwood's Well-being and Transport

Team Leader said: 'We are now most happy

and grateful to say that several companies and individuals stepped forward with offers of help to get the John Storer Charnwood minibus back on the road. We would like to thank Multi Vehicle Technology of Leicester who mended the vehicle free of charge, Go Plant Fleet Services, who lent us a van while the minibus was off the road and Loughborough businessman, **Dominic** Parr, who paid for a full valet of the minibus!"
