Scott has contributed to the following projects:

### Stirling Council – Unmet Taxi Demand Study

Scott undertook detailed video analysis of taxi rank footage, and collated the data accordingly. He analysed the recorded data and created the required outputs and contributed to the final report sent to Stirling council. Scott was also responsible for understanding and applying certain industry standard formulas that were required to properly benchmark the results.

#### **Nottingham City Transport – Passenger Surveys**

Scott helped design and conduct on and off bus passenger surveys as part of the TAS team tasked with assessing the impact of the new tram extension on bus patronage in Nottingham. He created the template for the data analysis and contributed to the final report.

### **Sunderland City Transport – Passenger Surveys**

Scott undertook consultation and analysis of cross city passenger movements and travel requirements in order to inform a larger piece of work which looked at, amongst other things, bus stop and interchange placements in the city centre. He was required to observe and record in significant detail and have an in-depth understanding of the project brief.

### **Nottingham City Transport – On Street Surveys**

Scott developed the input forms and interface for the CAPI on street surveys conducted in Nottingham. He acquired the software, quickly because proficient and created the forms from scratch. He transferred and cleaned the data, analysed and created the draft report for the client.
